
MICKEY KUHN

As a child actor, Mickey Kuhn is most noted for his portrayal of Beau Wilkes in the 1939 classic, GONE WITH THE WIND. Although he was part of one of the most famous movies of all time, Mickey says that he had no idea the impact this film would have, worldwide, in the decades to come.

Mickey's career continued to grow in the 1940's when he appeared in such films as MAGIC TOWN, THE SEARCHING WIND, ROARING RANGERS with the Durango Kid, THE RETURN OF RUSTY and HIGH CONQUEST. He appeared as Junior in DICK TRACY DETECTIVE and portrayed Kirk Douglas as a boy in Paramount's THE STRANGE LOVE OF MARTHA IVERS.

Mickey again became a part of Hollywood history as part of the cast of the 1948 western classic, RED RIVER, playing the Montgomery Clift role of Matt Garth as a boy. In 1950, he appeared once again



with Vivien Leigh, in the Academy Award winning, A STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE, making him the only actor to have appeared with Vivien Leigh in both of her Academy Award winning performances. Included in Mickey's other well-known films are: JUAREZ, BROKEN ARROW, SCENE OF THE CRIME and THE LAST FRONTIER. After returning from active duty in the Navy during the Korean War, Mickey appeared on television episodes **ALFRED** of HITCHCOCK PRESENTS, G.E. THEATER, and the NBC noontime drama, MATINEE THEATER. Mickey appeared in his last film AWAY ALL BOATS in 1962.

A recipient of the prestigious Golden Boot Award in 2005 for his outstanding work in westerns, Mickey considers it one of his "most treasured moments." For 25 years, the Golden Boot Awards honored actors, directors, writers and stunt people who made a major contribution to western films. It was sponsored by the Motion Picture and Television Fund and Hospital. The Boot raised over six million dollars for this worthwhile cause!

Mickey retired from American Airlines in 1995 and he and his lovely wife, Barbara, divide their time between Marblehead, Massachusetts in the summer and Naples, Florida in the winter
