

Julie Hedgepeth Williams grew up hearing the story of the Titanic firsthand from her great-uncle, Albert Caldwell, who survived the tragic 1912 shipwreck along with his wife, Sylvia, and infant son, Alden. Julie was so inspired by Albert's Titanic story that she majored in history (and English) at Principia College in Elsah, Illinois. She and her husband, Evan, live in a house that was built a year before the Titanic. Their sons are Weston and Alden. Julie is happy to be back in the Midwest and proud to be honored in Albert Caldwell's home territory. Albert grew up in Breckenridge, Missouri, and met Sylvia in college in Parkville, Missouri.
