



Richard Kent Harding MD is Professor of Neuropsychiatry and Behavioral Science at the University of South Carolina School of Medicine. He is a fourth generation physician. During those four generations, 28 family members became physicians. He is also the Grand Nephew of Warren G. Harding, 29th President of the United States.

Dr. Harding has served his profession and country in numerous leadership positions. He was a Lieutenant Commander in the U.S. Navy Reserve and served on the National Committee on Vital and Health Statistics with the Department of HHS in the Clinton and Bush administration. In 2001 Dr. Harding was President of the American Psychiatric Association, the oldest and third largest medical specialty society in the country. During his term he worked with government, military and civilian sectors to deal with the emotional impact of 911.

Dr. Harding is a frequent speaker on the topic of the illnesses of the Presidents and the problems that arise in trying to care for these ultimate VIPs.
